**Black Burnished Ware Roman Pottery Sherds (BB2)**

The North Kent Marshes potteries produced BB2 ware, London ware, and grey wares from the mid 1<sup>st</sup> to the 4<sup>th</sup> centuries. The top two sherds are from a dish that could have been produced there.



**An Assortment of Clay Pipe Bowls**

Soon after the introduction of tobacco in 1558, clay pipes were being manufactured in England. The Clay pipes pictured above are from the 17<sup>th</sup> and 19<sup>th</sup> centuries
